Their newest performance — in which students share their stories and express themselves through theatre, puppetry, juggling, American Sign Language poetry and visual art — runs Saturday and Sunday at 7 p.m. at The Artesian.

A year in the making, the show is open to people of all ages, abilities and languages.

“Apple Time” is the students’ term for a magical space that bridges people of all backgrounds and abilities, including those who are deaf, those who use sign language, hearing people, locals and newcomers.
